Eligibility: The regatta is open to boats in the following handicap classes:
PHRF Non-Spinnaker

Entrants must have a current valid rating on file with PHRF of the Chesapeake.

Skipper's

Meeting: The skipper's meeting for all days is at 11:00 a.m. on the deck behind the Café at Washington Sailing Marina.

Rendezvous: The rendezvous time for all days is at 12:00 p.m. near channel marker "R6."

Start: The start time for all days will be at approximately 12:15 p.m. The start will be between the pin "R6" and the no wake buoy directly west of "R6" where the Race Committee would normally anchor. The start sequence will be announced over the radio (channel 79A) and audible signals such as horns will be used.

Courses: The course will be announced at the skipper's meeting and over the radio (channel 69) shortly after the rendezvous time.

It is the intention of the Race Committee to run one race on the Middle Course. The Race Committee will select an appropriate course given the prevailing weather conditions and communicate that course to the fleet over the radio (channel 69) shortly after the rendezvous time.

Time Limit: 3 hours

Rules: The regatta will be governed by the “rules” as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020 (RRS) including the prescriptions of US Sailing (RRS) except as any of these are altered by the Notice of Race, Event Sailing Instructions or any amendments thereto. The Low-Point Scoring System in RRS Appendix A will apply.

Protests: Protests must be made in accordance with the US Sailing rules 2017-2020. Protests must be filed by emailing officers@discsailing.org by 6 p.m. of the day of the race.

Awards: Bragging rights.

Safety: ***All crewmembers shall wear Personal Flotation Devices (PFDs). Should the Race Committee or Standing Race Committee observe a crew member without a PFD, except for the removal or addition of clothing, the yacht will be disqualified from the race without a hearing. This modifies RRS 22.1, 40. DISC encourages all competitors to wear PFD's at all times. Safety is ultimately each skipper and crews responsibility.***

Other: Three 1 ton cranes and two launch ramps are available for launch and recovery. Some limited wet slips may be available through Washington Sailing Marina, 1 Marina Drive, Alexandria, Virginia.
